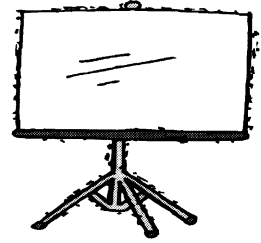
The film will commence at 7pm in the Museum theatre.

Commencement of Application for Leave to Appeal Rules and Supreme Court Criminal Trial Rules

The amendment to the Criminal Code No. 3 of 2000 has been gazetted and came into force on 12 April 2000.

Both the Supreme Court Criminal Rules: General Rules of Procedure in Criminal Proceedings and the Application for Leave to Appeal Rules will come into force on 1 May 2000.
