OUTLINE

Commerce (Trade Descriptions) Amendment Bill 1981

This Bill provides for an amendment to the Commerce (Trade Descriptions) Act 1905.

Provision is made for the imposition of penalties for any person who knowingly applies a false trade description to any foodstuffs intended for or entered for export.

Breaches of the provisions will be an indictable offence and subject to a fine of up to \$100,000 or 5 years imprisonment or both. However, provision is also made to proceed by summary jurisdiction with consequent fines up to \$5,000 or imprisonment for 1 year or both.
