CUSTOMS TARIFF AMENDMENT BILL (NO. 2) 1986

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

(Circulated by the Authority of the Minister for Industry, Technology and Commerce, Senator the Honourable John N. Button)

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OUTLINE

The purpose of the Bill is to enact a change to the Customs Tariff Act 1982 to remove the 2% General Tariff revenue duty from gold, including platinum-plated gold, unwrought or semi-manufactured, falling within item 71.07 in Schedule 3 to that Act.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

It is estimated that the cost to the revenue will be in the order of \$20,000 per annum.

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DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF THE BILL

- Clause 2 Date of Commencement the third day after the date of Royal Assent
- Clause 3 Schedule 3 of the Principal Act is amended by the removal of the 2% General Tariff revenue duty applicable to tariff item 71.07 which covers gold, including platinum-plated gold, unwrought or semi-manufactured.
