EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

OUTLINE

Eggs (Export Inspection Charge) Amendment Bill 1983

The purpose of this Bill is to increase the maximum rate of levy which may be prescribed for recoupment of the costs of export inspection services for eggs other than "eggs in shell" provided by the Commonwealth.

The Principal Act, the Eggs (Export Inspection Charge) Act 1982, had the purpose of introducing charges for Commonwealth inspection of eggs for export. The rates of charge are prescribed subject to a maximum of \$22 per 1,000 dozen eggs in shell and a maximum of \$16 per tonne for eggs other than eggs in shell. The amendment proposes to lift the maximum for eggs other than eggs in shell to \$33.00 per tonne.
