EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

OUTLINE

Edible Oils (Export Inspection Charge) Bill 1982

This Bill provides for a charge to apply to edible oils inspected under the provisions of the Exports (Dairy Produce) Regulations.

Provision is made for the imposition of charges and for rates of charge to be prescribed subject to a maximum of \$2.00 per tonne. Different rates of charge may be prescribed for different classes of edible oils. The Bill includes provision for exemptions from the charge to be made in regulations. The Bill also specifies by whom the charge is payable.
