## FISHERIES ADMINISTRATION BILL 1990

### GENERAL OUTLINE

The amendment removes from the Fisheries Administration Bill 1990 provision that allows the Australian Fisheries Management Authority (AFMA) to establish its own staff superannuation scheme. This provision is not needed as this can be done under other legislation.

The amendment also allows certain levies collected under various levy Bills associated with the Fisheries Management Bill 1991 to be appropriated to AFMA.

### FINANCIAL IMPACT STATEMENT

These provisions will have no direct financial impact. AFMA's right to establish its own staff superannuation scheme is not changed, while the new levy Bills are replacements for existing Bills.

## NOTES ON CLAUSES

### Clause 69

- 1 This clause is to be omitted. It allowed the Australian Fisheries Management Authority (AFMA) to establish its own staff superannuation scheme. This has been a standard provision for statutory authorities not staffed under the Public Service Act 1922. However the Superannuation Benefits (Supervisory Mechanisms) Act 1990 now gives the Minister for Finance the power to approve separate superannuation schemes for employees of Commonwealth statutory authorities. Clause 69 is therefore redundant.

### Clause 81 - Payments of amounts of levy

- 2 This clause previously referred to levy Acts associated with the Fisheries Act 1952. It allowed some of the moneys collected under these Acts to be paid to AFMA. The Fisheries Management Bill 1991 has its own set of levy Bills, these will replace the existing levy Acts as fishing licences etc, issued under the Fisheries Act 1952 expire and are replaced with instruments under the new Bill. This clause has therefore been amended to include all Acts and Bills under which moneys payable to AFMA will be collected.
