

COLONIAL LIGHT DUES COLLECTION.

No. 15 of 1934.

An Act to amend the *Colonial Light Dues Collection Act 1932*.

[Assented to 30th July, 1934.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the *Colonial Light Dues Collection Act 1934*. Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Colonial Light Dues Collection Act 1932** is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the *Colonial Light Dues Collection Act 1932-1934*.

2. Section two of the Principal Act is amended by omitting sub-sections (2.) and (3.). Application of Act.

3. After section four of the Principal Act the following section is inserted:—

“4A. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, exemptions from Colonial light dues, or remissions of the whole or part thereof, may be granted by the Collector of Customs for a State in circumstances similar to those under which the Board of Trade of the United Kingdom grant exemptions or remissions of light dues payable in the United Kingdom.” Exemptions and remissions.

4. Section ten of the Principal Act is amended by adding at the end thereof the words “, and in particular for defining the ships which shall be deemed to have passed and to have derived benefit from a lighthouse or buoy specified in the Schedule.” Regulations.
