AN ACT to amend the Cancer Committee Act 1937.

[Royal Assent 14 December 1988]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—This Act may be cited as the *Cancer Committee* Short title.

2—This Act shall commence on the day on which it receives Commencement.

4—Section 3 of the Principal Act is amended by omitting subsection (2A).

Validations.

5—The following provisions apply if, after 12th November 1988 and before the day on which this Act receives the Royal assent, appointments of all the members of the Committee were made that did not include the appointment of a person to whom section 3 (2A) of the Principal Act applies (in this section referred to as “the relevant person”):—

- (a) the Committee shall be deemed to be, and always to have been, validly and effectually constituted under the Principal Act notwithstanding the non-inclusion of the relevant person as a member of the Committee;
- (b) no act or proceeding of the Committee constituted by the members so appointed, or of any such member, that was purportedly done, taken, or commenced in pursuance of the Principal Act before the day on which this Act receives the Royal assent is invalidated or prejudiced by reason only of the fact that, at the time when the act or proceeding was done, taken, or commenced, the membership of the Committee did not include the relevant person.
