CROWN LANDS (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS).

No. 59 of 1959.

AN ACT to provide for the reinstatement of certain persons as purchasers of Crown lands, to authorize the sale by private contract of certain pieces of Crown land and the granting of certain other pieces of Crown land, to provide for the extinguishment of public rights of passage over certain lands and for the disposal of those lands, to authorize the Crown to purchase certain land, and for other purposes connected with the use and disposal of Crown lands.

[9 December 1959.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and incorporation.

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Crown Lands (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1959*.

(2) This Act is incorporated, and shall be read as one, with the *Crown Lands Act 1935* (in this Act referred to as the Principal Act).

Reinstatement of certain persons as purchasers of Crown land.

2—(1) The Commissioner may, with the consent of the Governor, reinstate the persons named in the first schedule as purchasers of the several areas of Crown land set opposite to their names respectively in that schedule, under the provisions of the Acts regulating the sale and disposition of Crown lands under which the purchases of those areas were made respectively.

(2) A person who is reinstated as the purchaser of any Crown land in pursuance of subsection (1) of this section is liable to pay all instalments due in respect of the land at the date of forfeiture, and all instalments thereafter due in respect thereof, together with the amount of fines and charges for the cost of advertising, as provided by section seventy-two of the Principal Act, and interest at the rate of five pounds per centum per annum from the dates when those instalments became due respectively.

Sale of Crown land to municipality of Hamilton.

3 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to the Warden, Councillors, and Electors of the municipality of Hamilton (in this section referred to as "the corporation") the piece of Crown land that is described in the second schedule for the sum of three thousand pounds, and upon payment by the corporation to the Commissioner of that sum, together with a grant fee of three pounds, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, by deed of grant, convey and alienate that piece of land to the corporation in fee simple.

Sale of Crown land to municipality of Westbury.

4 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to the Warden, Councillors, and Electors of the municipality of Westbury (in this section referred to as "the corporation") the piece of Crown land that is described in the third schedule for the sum of fifty pounds, and upon payment by the corporation to the Commissioner of that sum, together with survey and grant fees amounting to thirty-two pounds fifteen shillings, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, by deed of grant convey and alienate that piece of land to the corporation in fee simple.

Sale of Crown land to Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania.

5 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to the trustees of the Royal Yacht Club of Tasmania (in this section referred to as "the trustees") the piece of Crown land

that is described in the fourth schedule for the sum of fifty pounds, and upon payment by the trustees to the Commissioner of that sum, together with survey and grant fees amounting to sixteen pounds twelve shillings, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, by deed of grant convey and alienate that piece of land to the trustees in fee simple.

6 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to *Ross William Clark* of Wynyard in this State (in this section referred to as "the purchaser") the piece of Crown land that is described in the fifth schedule for the sum of thirty pounds, and upon payment by the purchaser to the Commissioner of that sum, together with survey and grant fees amounting to twenty-one pounds one shilling and sixpence, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, by deed of grant convey and alienate that piece of land to the purchaser in fee simple. Sale of Crown land to R. W. Clark.

7 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to *William Denis Mark Cook* of Hobart in this State (in this section referred to as "the purchaser") the piece of Crown land that is described in the sixth schedule for the sum of eight hundred and fifty pounds, and upon payment by the purchaser to the Commissioner of that sum, together with survey and grant fees amounting to twelve pounds nine shillings, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, by deed of grant convey and alienate that piece of land to the purchaser in fee simple. Sale of Crown land to W. D. M. Cook.

8 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to *Leonard Joseph Jagot* of Somerset in this State (in this section referred to as "the purchaser") the piece of land that is described in the seventh schedule for the sum of ten pounds, and upon payment by the purchaser to the Commissioner of that sum, together with survey and grant fees amounting to twelve pounds nine shillings, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, by deed of grant convey and alienate that piece of land to the purchaser in fee simple. Sale of Crown land to L. J. Jagot.

9 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to *Stanley Alfred Mock* of Rosebery in this State (in this section referred to as "the purchaser") the piece of Crown land that is described in the eighth schedule for the sum of fifty pounds, and upon payment by the purchaser to the Commissioner of that sum, together with a grant fee of three pounds, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, by deed of grant convey and alienate that piece of land to the purchaser in fee simple. Sale of Crown land to S. A. Mock.

Sale of Crown land to *W. M. Patrick*.

10 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to *William Maurice Patrick* of Ulverstone in this State (in this section referred to as "the purchaser") the piece of land that is described in the ninth schedule for the sum of ten pounds, and upon payment by the purchaser to the Commissioner of that sum, together with a grant fee of three pounds, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, by deed of grant convey and alienate that piece of land to the purchaser in fee simple.

Sale of Crown land to *R. G. Perkins*.

11 The Commissioner may sell by private contract to *Robert George Perkins* of Bicheno in this State (in this section referred to as "the purchaser") the piece of Crown land that is described in the tenth schedule for the sum of one hundred pounds, and upon payment by the purchaser to the Commissioner of that sum, together with survey and grant fees amounting to twelve pounds nine shillings, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, by deed of grant convey and alienate that piece of land to the purchaser in fee simple.

Grant of Crown land to *Burnie Marine Board*.

12 Upon payment to the Commissioner by the Marine Board of Burnie of grant fees amounting to six pounds, the Governor may, in the name and behalf of Her Majesty, by deed of grant convey and alienate to the Board in fee simple the pieces of Crown land that are described in the eleventh schedule.

Vesting of certain land in *Closer Settlement Board*.

13—(1) The proclamation, made under section sixty-eight of the *Lands Resumption Act 1910* on the twenty-sixth day of August 1949, relating to certain lands in the parishes of Meunna and Preolenna in the county of Wellington shall cease to have effect except with respect to anything done thereunder before the commencement of this Act.

(2) Upon payment to the Commissioner by the Closer Settlement Board of grant fees amounting to six pounds, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, by deed of grant convey and alienate to the Board in fee simple the pieces of land that are described in the twelfth schedule.

(3) Any land vested in the Closer Settlement Board under this section shall be deemed to be vested in that Board for the purposes of the *War Service Land Settlement Act 1950*.

Extinguishment of rights of passage of certain lands, and disposal of those lands.

14—(1) By force only of this section—

- (a) all public rights of passage over the lands that are described in the fourteenth, fifteenth, sixteenth, seventeenth, and eighteenth schedules are extinguished; and
- (b) those lands revert to, and revert in, Her Majesty absolutely, freed and discharged from all estates and interests therein subsisting in any person.

(2) On payment to the Commissioner by the Closer Settlement Board of a grant fee of three pounds, the Governor may, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, by deed of grant, convey and alienate to that Board in fee simple the piece of land that is described in the thirteenth schedule, and the land conveyed and alienated to the Board under this subsection shall vest in the Board as if it had been granted to it under section thirteen of the *Closer Settlement Act 1957*.

(3) The Governor may, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, by deed of grant convey and alienate—

- (a) to *Henry Gordon Bannon* of Sheffield in this State the piece of land that is described in the fourteenth schedule, on payment by him to the Commissioner of a grant fee of three pounds;
- (b) to *Vincenzo Piscioneri* of Beaconsfield in this State the piece of land that is described in the fifteenth schedule;
- (c) to *John Senior* and *Peggy Piddington Senior* both of Mole Creek in this State the piece of land that is described in the sixteenth schedule, on payment by them to the Commissioner of a grant fee of one pound;
- (d) to *Betty Edith Larner* and *Ian Harry Larner* both of Launceston in this State the piece of land that is described in Part I of the seventeenth schedule;
- (e) to *Horace Sweetland Oliver* of Launceston in this State the piece of land that is described in Part II of the seventeenth schedule;
- (f) to *Peter Thomas Tanner* of Exeter in this State the pieces of land that are described in Part III and Part IV of the seventeenth schedule;
- (g) to *James William Room* of Windermere in this State the piece of land that is described in Part I of the eighteenth schedule;
- (h) to *James William Room* and *Lindene Agnes Room* both of Windermere in this State the piece of land that is described in Part II of the eighteenth schedule; and
- (i) to *Thomas Gray Johnston* of Launceston in this State the piece of land that is described in Part III of the eighteenth schedule.

15—(1) The Commissioner may, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, purchase the lands that are described in the nineteenth schedule from the Hydro-Electric Commission for the sum of one hundred and twenty-five pounds eighteen shillings.

Purchase of

(2) Any land purchased by the Commissioner under this section shall, until it is granted or lawfully contracted to be granted in fee simple, be deemed to be Crown land for the purposes of the Principal Act.

Surrender of land by University of Tasmania.

16 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the Council of the University of Tasmania may surrender to Her Majesty the pieces of land described in the twentieth schedule and may execute all such deeds and other instruments as may be necessary for that purpose, and upon the surrender of any land under this section it shall be deemed to vest in Her Majesty for the purposes of a public road.

Continuance of s. 6 of *Crown Lands (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1947*.

17 Notwithstanding the repeal by the *Statute Law Revision Act 1958* of the *Crown Lands (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1947*, section six of that Act shall be deemed to continue in force until all the lands to which that section relates have been sold, conveyed, and alienated as provided in that section.
