



CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND SUPPLY ACT 1983-1984

TABLE OF PROVISIONS

1. Short title.
2. Issue and application of \$243,975,000.
3. Sum available for purposes specified in Schedule 1.
4. Credit to be given to the Treasurer in his accounts.

AN ACT to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue a sum for the service of the year ending on 30th June 1984.

[Royal Assent 1 June 1983]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—This Act may be cited as the *Consolidated Revenue Fund Supply Act 1983-1984* Short title.

Issue and application of \$243,975,000.

2—There may be issued and applied towards making good the supply hereby granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on 30th June 1984 the sum of \$243,975,000 out of the Consolidated Revenue, for the purposes and services expressed in Schedule 1, and the Treasurer is authorized to issue and apply the money so authorized to be issued and applied.

Sum available for purposes specified in Schedule 1.

3—The sum specified in section 2 is made available to satisfy the warrants under the hand of the Governor in respect of any purposes and services set forth in Schedule 1.

Credit to be given to the Treasurer in his accounts.

4—The Treasurer shall be allowed credit in his accounts for any sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any warrant mentioned in section 3, and the receipts of the respective persons to whom any sums of money are so paid are a full and valid discharge to the Treasurer in passing his accounts for such sums as are mentioned in the receipts and he shall receive credit for them accordingly.
