

BE it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title
and incorpora-
tion.

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Marine Board of Hobart (Validation of Expenditure) Act 1956*.

(2) This Act is incorporated, and shall be read as one, with the *Marine Act 1921* (in this Act referred to as the Principal Act).

Validation of
certain ex-
penditure.

2 Notwithstanding anything in the Principal Act, as in force during the financial year that ended on the thirtieth day of June 1954, the Marine Board of Hobart shall be deemed at all times during that financial year, to have had power to expend, out of the revenues of the Board, by way of extraordinary expenditure under paragraph v of section seventy-five of that Act, any sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of six hundred and sixty-eight pounds five shillings and one penny, and the sum so expended by that Board during that financial year is validated accordingly.

AN ACT to amend the *Education Act 1932*.
[16 May 1956.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title
and citation.

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Education Act 1956*.

(2) The *Education Act 1932*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section nineteen C of the Principal Act is amended by omitting therefrom the word “secondary” and substituting therefor the word “tertiary”.
