AN ACT to amend the Parliamentary Salaries and Allowances Act 1973.

[Royal Assent 18 April 1984]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—This Act may be cited as the *Parliamentary Salaries and Allowances Amendment Act 1984*. Short title.

Principal Act. **2**—In this Act, the *Parliamentary Salaries and Allowances Act 1973** is referred to as the Principal Act.

3—Clause 6 of Part IV of Schedule 3 to the Principal Act is amended as follows:—

- (a) by omitting from subclause (1) “ There ” and substituting “ Subject to subclause (6), there ”;
- (b) by inserting in the Table to subclause (1) “ , or Deputy Leader for,” after “ Leader for ”, where twice occurring and after “ Leader of ”, “ or Deputy Leader of ” where twice occurring.
- (c) by omitting from subclause (2) “ There ” and substituting “ Subject to subclause (6), there ”;
- (d) by inserting after subclause (5) the following sub-clauses:—

(6) Where the expenses incurred by the holder of an office specified in the first column of the table set forth in subclause (1) exceeds the travelling allowance to which he would be entitled under that clause or under subclause (2), the holder of that office is entitled to a travelling allowance at a rate equivalent to the actual expenses incurred by him on submission of evidence of those expenses.

(7) For the purposes of this clause, “ expenses ” means reasonable expenses incurred in respect of accommodation, entertainment, facilities required for conferences or meetings, meals, transport, and telephone calls.
