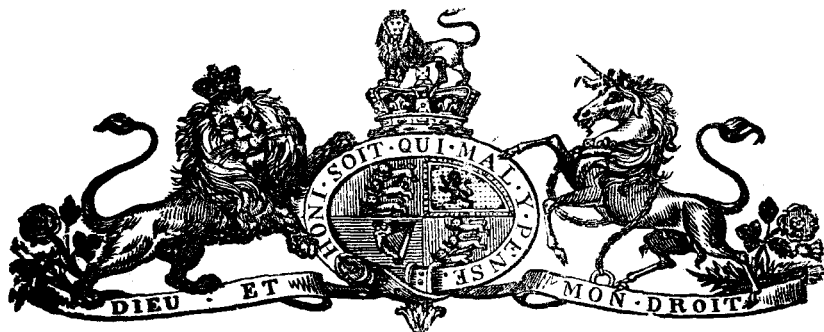

AN ACT to amend "The Boundary Fences Act, 1853." [29 October, 1883.] A.D. 1883.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Boundary Fences Act, 1853:," PREAMBLE.
17 Vict. No. 12.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 In every award made under "The Boundary Fences Act, 1853," it shall be lawful for the Arbitrators to award and determine the amount of costs incidental to the making of such award which shall be paid by one party to the other party thereto, not exceeding in any case in the whole the sum of Twenty-five Pounds; and such costs shall be recoverable from the party liable to pay the same in the same manner as any sum of money and interest thereon mentioned in the Thirteenth Section of the said Act is thereby made recoverable. Arbitrators may award costs.

2 This Act and the said Act shall, save as altered by this Act, be read and construed together as one Act. Acts to be read together.

3 This Act may be cited as "The Boundary Fences Act, 1884." Short title.
